

### THE COMPLEX RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN COST AND QUALITY

As we all know, inflation is real.

Both the Board and I have a fiduciary responsibility to operate as a healthy organization and I was recently encouraged to explain why most fees were raised this year.

The simple answer: with inflation at 4.75% per year since 2019, our budget was poised to come up short. The big drivers: utilities (up 68%) and employee healthcare (up 36%), both of which are critical components. But all costs have risen - everything from payroll processing fees to the price of supplies.

Most fees, especially in swim programming, had not been materially altered in 4-5 years. The increase, along with prudent cutbacks in spending yielded a budget which will allow for the continuance of quality programming and maintenance of staffing.

#### **AGE GROUP DIVISION**



#### **DEVELOPMENTAL UPDATE**

Sunday, November 12, all Nadadores are invited to compete in a local dive meet in Long Beach. Participation is optional. Coaches will work with interested divers, to ensure participation readiness.

<u>Blue Group</u>: Newer athletes have been working on safe progressions as an introduction to diving. Divers have jumped off the 5-meter and 7-meter platform, while others are learning their front and back lineups. Some divers are even learning front flips! And, five divers have transitioned into a 2 or 3-day Novice group to get more training time.



**Gold Group**: Gold divers have been working on optional dives for the McCormick and the Chris Vonk Invites. Many freshmen are working on skill-acquisition to ensure they are ready for the high school season. Athletes are working on an 11-dive list which includes competition dives on both boards.



**Gym 2 Dive**: Welcome to our newest Nadadores, Maddie Chao, Alex Tennant, Emily Tennant, Annabell Flynn, Kara Codilla, Syd Park, Arianna Bryant, and Chloe Bozinovski. Our gymnasts join us from South Coast, Azarian, Wildfire and Nationals. Gym 2 Dive athletes have been perfecting hurdles and learning basic skills which can be quite challenging for high-level gymnasts transitioning into dive. Others have been working on harder optionals.



Novice 2a, 2b, 3a, 3b and 4: Divers are working on three levels of our program structure, Novice Bronze 2, Novice Bronze 1 and Intro to Competitive Diving. As we head into local competitions, athletes will be bringing back their hurdles, optional dives and learning new dives/skills.



Elite Bronze 1, 2 and 3: Divers in the Bronze groups have been working on very strict basics. They are mainly focused on balance, posture, flexibility and entries. The athletes in this group will be working on basics through the McCormick meet and may bring back their easy-optional for the Chris Vonk meet.
